State Employees Reauthorize Your Membership!

Time is running out to reauthorize your membership. After October 13, 2023, any non-reauthorized union member will have their union membership cancelled by Civil Service.

The Civil Service rule changes that went into effect in 2020 require state employees to reauthorize their union membership every year, or their membership will expire.

Members who allow their membership to expire will lose all the benefits of membership at that time, including, voting rights on the upcoming wage reopener that we are currently negotiating, access to information, and the great member-only benefits you receive as a SEIU Local 517M member.

Poll Shows Strong Public Support for Unions

A poll commissioned by the AFL-CIO and conducted by GBAO of registered voters found widespread support for unions across party lines. Voter support comes from unlikely sources with Republican and Independents supporting unions, and younger voters likely to support them.

Support for unions was highest among the youngest voters. For voters under 30, 88% support unions and 77% say unions are needed more now than in past years.
