No Cuts, No Shutdown Rally and Lobby Day

On Wednesday, September 24th, union leaders and members from SEIU Local 517M joined with our partners in the Michigan Education Association and the American Federation of Teachers for the **No Cuts**, **No Shutdown Rally and Lobby Day** to demand a budget that supports working people and protects the services our members provide every day.



The day began at Central United Methodist Church, where we were welcomed with warm smiles, coffee, and an overview of what was at stake. Leaders from the SEIU Michigan State Council energized the room and prepared us to meet with legislators and deliver a clear message: we demand action. A government shutdown would have halted school funding, stop critical roadwork, jeopardize essential services like food safety testing, crime labs, mental health support, and close the Secretary of State offices, cutting off essential services that residents rely on every day. Medicaid cuts would have hit rural working families especially hard, while public safety would suffer with potential layoffs of the MIOSHA, lab

staff, and inspectors who keep our food, water, and workplaces safe.



At 10:30 a.m., MEA held a press conference, followed by SEIU, to call for a balanced, ontime budget that meets the needs of all Michiganders. Our delegation, along with SEIU Healthcare Michigan, then met with Representative John Roth (R-District 104) for a

productive 30-minute conversation focused on the issues directly affecting

our members. Rep. Roth was genuine, respectful, and receptive to our concerns. He expressed confidence that a budget would be passed on time, noting that no one wants a shutdown. We emphasized that a shutdown would harm every single citizen of our state, and he agreed.

After our legislative meetings, our team completed a lit drop at the Capitol, placing postcards with our concerns at every House and Senate office. We ended the day proud, united, and confident that our voices had been heard loud and clear.



State Employee Benefits Effective Today

Today is the first day of the new state fiscal year. As such, a couple of economic provisions that were negotiated last summer go into effect today.

Wages

Effective 10/1/25, a 3% base wage increase.

Longevity

All amounts for longevity payments were doubled. Once eligible, they are paid every October throughout a member's state career. This is the first increase since the start of collective bargaining in the 1980s!

Tech Notes - News for Technical Unit Members

This section of the newsletter is dedicated to the issues being faced by our State of Michigan Technical Unit members.

Technical Unit President Nomination Period

On Monday, October 27, 2025, SEIU Local 517M will hold an election for Technical Bargaining Unit President. Members running for this office must be bargaining unit members in good standing.

As per the SEIU Local 517M Bylaws; Article VI, Section 5: All candidates shall have been members in good standing of the Union for at least twelve (12) continuous months preceding the election ballot count date. No person who has been convicted of a felony as defined in Section 504 of the Landrum-Griffin Act (or an indictable offense in Canada) shall, in accordance with the provisions of applicable law, be eligible to hold office in this Union.

The nomination period began September 8, 2025 and ends October 8, 2025 at Noon. If multiple candidates apply, election ballots will be available starting the afternoon of October 8, 2025. The voting period will be from October 8, 2025 through October 26, 2025 at 4:00 p.m. The deadline for requesting a paper ballot is October 20, 2025.

Ballots will be counted on Monday, October 27, 2025. The successful candidate will take office on November 1, 2025.
